Hello church,

I have started reading a book about a group of Christians called Puritans. They have had a bad press over the years and history tells us that they have caused atrocities, particularly in and amongst the indigenous peoples of North

America. As usual, this is not the full story, and their real intent and focus was living a life of holiness to God. Even the term 'puritan' was not one they chose themselves but was given to them by those who wanted to put them down, sometimes even fellow Christians. The so called 'Holiness movement' has also had a bad reputation over the years.


It makes me wonder what possibly could be wrong with trying to live a life more set apart (for that is what holiness means) for God· Of course, there is nothing wrong but this does not seem to be the aim of many Christians I meet, but is something that we are called to as I mentioned previously in The Stream· I use the words 'seem to be' because that is merely my perception and 1 Corinthians 13 tells me that "<sup>7</sup> Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things·" This means that rather than proclaiming judgement over them, I should believe the best and hope the best, that I should believe that they are following the same aim, to be more like Jesus·

We don't all follow the same path through life. The Holy Spirit deals with us as an individual. So while I am being challenged and need to submit to the Holy Spirit's work in one aspect of my life, you are being challenged and responding to something very different. The aim is the same, to be "changed from glory into glory, 'til in heaven we take our place. 'til we cast our crowns before Him, lost in wonder, love and grace."

It is very hard not to compare ourselves with others. It is difficult not to be proud that we have moved past a stage in our Christian walk that others are struggling with or to be envious of someone else's progress when we are still struggling. We all have a role to play. To guard our hearts against envy and jealousy. To not be proud and conceited. We owe it all to our heavenly Father who has extended to us all the same grace, the same mercy, the same love which we did not nor ever will deserve. It is all Him, by Jesus Christ, through the Holy Spirit.

Let us submit to living in Romans 12 v 1-8 and also the rest of Romans 12, 13 and 14. Give it a read and may the Holy Spirit apply it to all our hearts, yours and mine.

"12 I appeal to you therefore, brothers,<sup>[a]</sup> by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.<sup>[b] 2</sup> Do not be conformed to this world,<sup>[c]</sup> but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.<sup>[d]3</sup> For by the grace given to me I say to

every one among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgement, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned<sup>. 4</sup> For as in one body we have many members.<sup>[e]</sup> and the members do not all have the same

function, <sup>5</sup> so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. <sup>6</sup> Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; <sup>7</sup> if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; <sup>8</sup> the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads,<sup>[1]</sup> with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness."


**Chris Troy** – We give thanks that Rowan's mum's leukaemia is now in
