Message from Mike... Hello church,

I often wonder whether I have fully grasped the significance of Easter: These thoughts this year are inspired by my sermon of 30th March: As I prepared the sermon I felt myself challenged: Have I had the eyes of my heart enlightened so that I know what is the hope to which He has called me: Do I know what are the riches of His



glorious inheritance in the saints. Have I experienced the immeasurable greatness of Him towards me· I don't think I have got anywhere near grasping these things. Add to them the understanding all that Jesus worked for me on the cross and through the Father resurrecting Him from the dead· I can maybe talk about all the theory and all the theological writings that try to explain it but have I really experienced the power of the cross and the resurrection· It is perhaps like people who have a near death experience and are then are resuscitated· There are stories that are told of people who have seen the horrors of hell· When resuscitated they are energised to tell as many people as possible with the desperate desire to rescue everyone they know from that terrible destiny·

Which reminds me of the story Jesus told about the rich man and Lazarus in Luke 16 verses 19-31. Having experienced hell he was desperate for Lazarus to return to life and tell all his relatives. Easter is all about someone who returned to life to provide a way to escape the horrors of hell.

If then I could somehow experience the cross and what it meant to Jesus and to the Father, I could get a better grasp of what was achieved by Jesus' death and resurrection. I have no old life to compare my life to as I accepted Jesus as my saviour at a young age and have known little more than life as a believer in Christ. I can though, look at others and say "I would be there myself if it was not for God's amazing grace". I could say with the hymn writer; Give me a sight O Saviour of Thy wondrous love for me. Of the love that brought Thee down to earth to die on Calvary. It is not necessary to actually experience these things when we have the Holy Spirit to reveal them to us.

One additional thing that got to me was a sermon by J John. He said our worst sins could be put on us as a label. Whether a liar, or an adulterer, or thief, or murderer, a person who did not honour their parents etc etc. Just imagine wearing that label around so everyone could see. Then imagine Jesus taking your label, your worst sin, from your chest and sticking on His own. Then imagine His Father having to look on Him with all ours sins on Him. Perhaps we should stop this Easter and give the Holy Spirit time to reveal a little more of what Jesus' death and resurrection achieved for us.

I pray that His would inspire us a little more to tell our friends, relatives and neighbours about Jesus. That this revelation would compel us to want to speak of Jesus wherever we are not hide our lamp under a basket. Matthew 5 verses 14-16. "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

1 Give me a sight, O Saviour, Of Thy wondrous love to me, Of the love that bro't Thee down to earth, To die on Calvary. Oh, make me understand it, Refrain: Help me to take it in, What it meant to Thee, the Holy One, To bear away my sin. Was it the nails. O Saviour. That bound Thee to the tree? Nay, 'twas Thine everlasting love, Thy love for me, for me. Oh, wonder of all wonders, That thro' Thy death for me. My open sins, my secret sins, Can all forgiven be. Then melt my heart, O Saviour, Bend me, yea, break me down, Until I own Thee Conqueror, And Lord and Sov'reign crown.






**June 22<sup>nd</sup>** – Churches Together in Gravesham picnic and celebration in the Fort Gardens, Gravesend. Further details to follow
