Message from Mike...

Hi Church,

I pray every blessing on you all for the New Year. That God would richly bless you, that you would be built up and encouraged in your faith as we face another year. We don't know what is coming in the next year, but we know that God does. He has it all under control, and He knows exactly what He is doing.



But how do we live with that attitude and, even more importantly, how do we explain our thoughts and feelings to our friends and relatives who perhaps do not believe in God? This is particularly difficult when we experience the same things happening throughout the world. We are affected by the same wars, the same natural disasters, the same changes in wealth and poverty. How can we show Jesus in these situations and how can we be Jesus to our friends and relatives?

I'm not sure that I have all the answers to these questions, but I will try and give some hints.

I know I keep banging on about this but the first place I must go is 'how is my relationship with Jesus?'· Is it a 'shopping list' relationship where I list all the things I want to happen and then quickly stop so He doesn't ask me anything. Do I spend any time at all with Him? Is it a 'tick box relationship' where I do my daily devotional and then forget Him for the rest of the day? Does He fill all my day and direct all my thoughts and actions. Do I really believe He sees all I do, hears all my words, understands all my thoughts, and is He ever present in my every activity?

Do I know who I am in Him?

1 Peter 2 v 9-10 - 9 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light. 10 Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Am I really aware of all He has done for me?

We looked at this earlier this year, but it is so easy to forget what He has done and the difference He has made in our lives. A lot easier to forget it seems than to remember. Yet, we are reminded to count our blessings. We could do worse than to look back and remember when and how God has blessed us. I have included a prayer from my devotional this morning. Perhaps you could pray this with me:

"As I reflect on this year, I'm so deeply encouraged at the ways you have been at work in, through and around me· Lord on the cusp of a new year, I give myself to you again – body, soul and spirit· Be glorified in and through me, my Lord"

Having an attitude of gratitude should really stand out amongst the people we meet, not complaining about our lot but being content with what we have. Our actions should support our words, and we should clearly demonstrate that we are people of faith not of fear.

We need to be consistent in our witness. There is no point moaning about things that are happening around us and then telling people that we have faith. That undermines our witness and makes us look the hypocrites that Christians are so often accused of being.

Yes, we must be honest with people, but this should always be balance with a 'But God has/can/does' attitude.

I pray that 2025 would be a year of growth in our relationship with our Saviour, that we would be willing to stand up and be counted as children of the King and that people would see this and ask questions that He will give us the best answers to
